#### FPC CHURCH FAMILY ORIGIN

First Presbyterian Church is and always has been a family church. Of those gathered by Peter and Sophia Flury, in what is now Dubuque's Washington Park, to sign the document creating this church, only nine did not carry a last name of at least one other of the 35 gathered there on Christmas Day, 1847. Not only was a church created, but more importantly a "church family" was born.

Over time, memories can fade and disappear: Facebook may be a good tool to "jog memories" when long separated loved ones yearn for reunion; but the most effective tool is the "gathering of family on special occasions." Something magical happens on these occasions: a mysterious "spark" triggers memories, existing below but near to the surface of consciousness, that come blazing into full view.

The recent death of long-time church member Billy Stant was the occasion for one of those triggering sparks – since "in-place sheltering" had all but ended, his family's invitation for the church to gather at his funeral was a reminder of the importance of family gatherings to reunite loved ones. At the funeral meal, we looked at family pictures – so many of them were taken in the life of the church. In this picture, the

family had gathered to help recognize Barb Stant's dedicated church service. While four of the Stants pictured in this late 1990's photo (Billy, his mother Barb, his sister Viola and brother-in-law Kenny) have since died, memories of them in our midst came flooding back to us around the table. As we continued to eat, sharing stories from Billy's 75 years, it was evident Billy's life had been defined in the church over the span of 15 different pastors.

Family memories may be good tools for reuniting loved ones, but shared with others in the life of our church, these combined memories define the "First Presbyterian Church family."
