- The church officers have made steps to strengthen their personal relationship with God; which is in turn strengthening their spiritual leadership at FPC.

- A variety of people, including children and teenagers, are sharing their gifts of time and talent in the life of the church.
- We are slowly building relationships with people and organizations in our immediate neighborhood.


# LET'S CELEBRATE GOD'S FAITHFULNESS TO FPC DUBUQUE!

Like other churches, we have challenges . . .

- We are small: 65% of all PC(USA) churches are our size or smaller.
- According to a group that tracks trends in the church, our experience mirrors the top ten current trends in US churches:
  - 1. Worship attendance will average 80% of pre-COVID numbers.
  - 2. Neighborhood churches will become a movement.
  - 3. There will be more community focus than any period in 30 years.
  - 4. There will be more emphasis on evangelism than any period in 30 years.
  - 5. More churches will merge or be adopted than any period in 30 years.
  - 6. Denominational structures will begin to look more like networks.
  - 7. Departures of pastors will increase by 20%.
  - 8. Ministry training will begin to evolve into different models.
  - 9. Church giving will decline 5%.
  - 10. The micro church could become a movement.

But God is blessing our church in many ways . . .

• We are blessed to have members of all ages, with a strong number of children.
56% of all PC(USA) members are over age 56 --- 40% of FPC Dubuque members are over age 56. If we were to graph the age distribution of actual worshippers, we would skew even younger.



 We are blessed to have not yet members and friends of the church join us in worship and fellowship.

Community is an important value of the FPC congregation. Dick and Delores Muntz were significant contributors to this value, and fostered it with care during the days their family occupied the back pew near the sanctuary entrance. Randy died in 2016, and Dick and Delores are now our "friends at home," as their health doesn't allow them to get to church – but we continue to benefit from their legacy.

Dick, one of the oldest members of our church, holds memories in his still-sharp mind: his engaging conversations are the key unlocking them. When the "door of his heart is open", what is seen is like looking through one of our church windows: anyone listening to him is drawn into a fascinating room of First Presbyterian Church history.

It was Dick who made one of the only church bathrooms featuring a stained-glass window in the late 1990's. It was Dick who (along with Billy Stant) left church after Markco Miller's wedding in the mid-1980's in their tuxedos to walk the John Deere picket line. And it is Dick who has been present at practically every monthly Men's Breakfast since it began in the late 1970's, always ready to share these stories – join us at 8 on the first Saturday morning of every month at Papa Oz's (at the corner of JFK and the "artillery", as Dick likes to call the NW Arterial).
