Stewardship Sunday

October 31, 2021

Stewardship in the Bible has to do with understanding our life - our time, treasure, and our talent - as given to us by God so we can manage it in a way that brings good to others on God's behalf. It is like when a family member, friend, or employer asks you to watch over something. As you "manage" what they have entrusted to your care; you're "stewarding."

This time of year is an opportunity to ask ourselves how we are doing at stewarding the gifts God has given us - especially as we begin to re-emerge from the uncertainty of the past 18 months.

Prior to October 31st, you will receive a letter encouraging you to thoughtfully and prayerfully engage the question: "How am I joining in God's work and ministry around me?" It is a time to consider how you will commit to sharing in the ministry and mission of First Presbyterian Church in 2022.

In the letter will be a pledge card to fill in with your financial commitment. You are invited to bring this card with you to worship on October 31 and place it in the offering plate as an act of dedication. If you are unable to attend worship in-person on the 31st, feel free to mail it to the church, in care of our treasurer, Bob Monthey.

Of course, we encourage you to think wide and deep about stewardship - because it is about so much more than finances. It is a way of living in commitment to God.






