






## PASTOR WILL BE OUT OF THE OFFICE


The Mission Committee will be offering reflections about the relationship between FPC and our Dubuque community in this space over the coming months, as we enter into our 175th year of ministry in 2022. A special thanks to Tom Jack, for keeping us rolling, with the following article about the life of one very special FPC member who faithfully served his church and community.

## 2022 - A YEAR TO CELEBRATE FPC'S 175<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY

On Christmas Eve in 1847, First Presbyterian Church was "born", which means that next year, 2022, we will celebrate our 175<sup>th</sup> anniversary. As a church we will not only look back over our history, but also look into our future ministry on the corner of 17<sup>th</sup> and lowa St.

One person who stands out as having made a profound impact on our recent history is Leroy Vogt. While his memory is captured on a plaque in the narthex, his presence can still be felt in every congregational activity of our church. Leroy seemed to spend most days of his life in the church, truly dedicated to her: oftentimes a visitor to the church would find him playing the piano by himself (no, he and God were keeping each other happy with his music): perhaps if we listen closely, we too will still hear him!

The congregation might consider dedicating this anniversary year in memory of Leroy, who died in May of 2014. Leroy was born in South Dakota on Pearl Harbor Day in 1922, so his 100th birthday is three weeks short of our 175th anniversary. Leroy came to the church after serving in the Navy during World War II and his presence in many ways not only parallels the history of our church, but also helped shape the ministry here. For many years he served as our clerk of session and Sunday school superintendent. He was also known as "Mr. Presbyterian" in the larger community: serving at UD as the bookstore manager, being active in the Presbytery, and later working as janitor of Bethany Home (a home donated by a Presbyterian family from our church). Leroy died in his Bethany Home apartment on a Sunday morning. His last Presbyterian presence was to receive Communion with his church family. Those who knew Leroy, miss his presence, but we are comforted knowing his legacy of Christian discipleship lives on. A committee will be formed to plan for our 175th celebration, and perhaps this committee will consider looking at our recent history through the eyes of Leroy Vogt.
