Manor Care/Bethany Home by Katrina



This summer, I have had the joy of serving at Bethany Home and Manor Care once per month. Both are very unique opportunities to share God's love with people in our community. Bethany Home provides a wide range of care to individuals, from independent living apartments to skilled nursing rooms. One fun fact about Bethany Home is that First Presbyterian Church helped establish the retirement home in 1923 and continues to participate in the ministry there today. On the fourth Sunday of each month, Jill, our pianist, joins the preacher to provide a brief worship service that includes scripture reading, preach-

ing, singing, and praying and is almost always followed by ice cream with the residents. Children have joined in this ministry by passing out the hymns to the residents, straightening chairs before and after the service, and by chatting with the residents, Sharing the Gospel at Manor Care is also an important ministry of the church. The residents at Manor Care have a wide-range of medical needs. First Presbyterian Church is the only protestant church that provides worship services here. On the first Friday of each month, a minister from the church provides scripture reading, a very short devotional style sermon, music of various kinds, and prayer. These residents truly appreciate the tender and silent moments shared with this group. As transitions continue at FPC, please pray for these ministries and consider joining us for worship.



Beth's Mission to the Dominican Republic

On May 29, seven members of the UD community paired with six members of Morristown Presbyterian Church, and arrived in the Dominican Republic. This was a return visit to the village of El Batey for both groups. El Batey is an isolated village which is petitioning to rename itself Christ the King - to reflect their deep hopes for life and witness emanating from their community. Nearly two years ago, the bridge that links the community to the highway washed out. An ambitious effort to raise funds and trained volunteers is underway. In the meanwhile the community must rely on a very rough, long, roundabout road. This has resulted in diminishing critical contacts like medical care.



In the midst of this isolation and hope we rejoined brothers and sisters, and shared in their dream for a growing village center. Part of our ministry was simply to communicate that they were not forgotten. We worked mano a mano (hand in hand) to construct a wall for a park, across from a grocery under construction, and down the road from the community center in progress (with which we assisted last visit.) It is hoped that this village center, will give women a place to sell food items, attract (once again) visiting baseball teams for games and tournaments, and encourage people from neighboring villages to come by for worship, food, fellowship.

Sharing worship with our host congregation for three services allowed us to be present (and provide ordained clergy) for the rare celebration of communion, and dedication of babies. Two rounds of VBS and an accompanying fiesta brought the children and parents of the community together for growth and play. The village leaders were heartened both by our witness to their needs and for what they found to be an exemplary modeling of Christian unity: two previous unacquainted groups joined to work and worship together with such heart (i.e. Morristown and UD). Many thanks to the FPC community for the interest, prayers, and support.

Mission Trip to Green Bay—Bryan's Final Report

Sunday morning, June 24th, 10 servant leaders embarked from Dubuque on a journey of Christian service. The team was filled with excitement and a twinge of apprehension as we drove to Green Bay. Conversation ranged from summer jobs, music, video games to school as we contemplated what the next week might have in store for us. Although some had been on similar trips in the past, the fact that each mission trip is unique was not lost on anyone. Rolling into the parking lot of the school which would provide our accommodations for the week, we saw 340 young adults and leaders with their luggage. It was quite the sight to see all together in a worship kick-off service helping us embrace the opportunity before us.

As the week began, each of the participants met their teams and leaders. Throughout the week the teams and community bonded. Whether in devotion time with our residents during the day, intense games of Ultimate Frisbee (and an occasional set of push-ups) at night, or ice cream expeditions at 11pm, Christ's hand was at work building each of us and keeping us focused on the delivery of his will through our hands. All of the teams not only succeeded in delivering much-needed repairs at homes, but they also succeeded in touching the community with the overwhelming expression of God's love.

In total, 54 teams from 5 states and various denominations came together with a single goal, to express Gods love, and accomplished this through providing over 10,000 hours of community service throughout the Green Bay community. None of this would have happened without the love and support of our small, but faithful church family. From my heart and the collective hearts of all those who were touched by this experience, thank you.












