## **Transition News**

The Session at First Presbyterian Church is very determined to complete the steps needed to call a new pastor. After meeting with Presbytery personnel, the Session held church chats and gained information from an online survey to complete a mission study. After Presbytery approved their work, the Session called a congregational meeting to elect a Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC).



On August 26, the PNC was elected, and they have begun their work to write a Ministry Information Form (MIF). After this document is completed, it will need to be approved by the Session and then the Com-



mittee on Ministry (COM) before it can be uploaded into a computer database where Presbyterian pastors, who are seeking a call, can view it. The PNC is hoping to complete the MIF document in time for the October 14 Session meeting. Once the Session approves it, the MIF will be sent for approval by the COM that meets in early November. Please keep all involved in this process, including the person whom God is calling, in your prayers.

## The Bee Branch Extension Project



You may have noticed the work being done on 17th Street right by the church. This is part of the Bee Branch extension project. The purpose of this project is to increase the capacity of the storm sewer from the Lower Bee Branch Creek up 17th Street to West Locust Street. A larger storm sewer and additional high-capacity storm drains will help alleviate the flash flooding frequently experienced on these streets. The estimated completion date of the entire project is 2021.

It is our understanding from letters received from the city of Dubuque that this year's work will stop at the current site of Heeb Street – Segment 4 of Phase 2. Parking will be an issue as the project advances up 17th Street. We will keep you posted.


## **FPC Connection to the Community**

First Presbyterian Church has a long history in Dubuque. Local historian Carole Loetscher mentions our church in her new book, "Wood: The History of Farley & Loetscher Manufacturing Company Once the Largest



In the spirit of his creativity, Christian included steam heat in the house. It was the tirst home in Dubuque to have it. At the tirne Christian died in 1922 the property was valued at \$15,000, In 1923 Mary donated it to the Presbyterian Church as a home for retired ministers and their wives. Today the house and subsequent additions are a retirement community known as Bethany Home. A variety of Farley & Loetscher memorabilia can be seen in Bethany Home's parker.

Dick Loetacher's father, Arnold (youngest son of Christian) was born in the house and told Dick. We were guite a gang. Our Christmas tree was large and real with real candles. When the candles were lit on Christmas Eve. we sat around the tree each with a five gallon bucket of water in case 4 aught fire. Millwork Company in the World." The pulpit and one stained glass window are from her family's company.



Bethany Home began as the Loetscher family home and then was given to the Presbyterian Church.
