
Online Worship Update

General Assembly Co-Moderators Elected On First Ballot

Elona Street-Stewart, Executor of the Synod of Lakes and Prairies, and the Rev. Gregory Bentley, pastor of Fellowship Presbyterian Church in Huntsville, Alabama, were elected by 304 votes on the first ballot as Co-Moderators of the 224th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA) on June 20, 2020. The first Online assembly ran from June 19-27 and Bentley said, "I am hippopotamus happy and dinosaur delighted".

Street-Stewart said that the world needs a church that has no fear over its diversity. She is a descendant of the Delaware Nanticoke tribe and the first Native American to serve as both Moderator and as a Synod Executive in the PC (USA). She was here in our sanctuary about a year ago when she took part in the memorial service for the Rev. Henry Fawcett.

Rev. Bentley, who is African American, said that "We need to create space to say 'You are welcome here- not just with words but a space to genuinely share our lives.' I'd rather be two miles deep and two inches wide, rather than the other way around. Let's drill down on a few things and really get a handle on it." The Moderators would appreciate prayers for stamina, perseverance and patience during these next two years.
