

World Communion Sunday, October 4, 2020

In this unprecedented time, the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (USA) has approved the online celebration of Communion and, according to the Book of Order, it is the responsibility of the Session to authorize the celebration of the Lord's Supper. The Session of First Presbyterian Church has so authorized the online celebration of the Sacrament on October 4, 2020 – World Communion Sunday. In this time when we are separated by space, yet united in the Spirit and members of one family through our baptism, we remem-



ber that Christ is always at work, gathering us in unique ways.

In preparation for the Sacrament, the Session and Deacons are providing bread and juice for each household of our congregation *to mark our connection through the Holy Spirit as one body of Christ.* An elder or deacon will be contacting you to coordinate the delivery or pick-up of the elements, which they will pray over in preparation for this holy celebration. If you are not comfortable receiving pre-prepared elements, we invite you to use bread and beverage from your own kitchen.

If you, or someone close to you, has not received a coordination contact on or before Friday, October 1, please contact a member of the Session and they will assist you.


Bibles for our 3rd Graders

The Enneagram describes nine different personality types and maps each of these types on a nine-pointed diagram which helps to illustrate how the types relate to one another.

CAFÉ MINISTRY Food and Volunteers Needed October 29

Congregation, we are the food hosts for the October 29th Café Ministry held at First Congregational UCC. This month, we get to provide enough hotdogs and buns needed to feed at least 200 people! If there are 8 in a package, we need 25 packages of hotdogs and 25 packages of buns. They say the number of people stopping by to pick up the to-go meals is increasing and the need is great.

They still use volunteers but have created a system to spread people out to follow social distancing guidelines. You can sign up for the week of Oct. 29 or any other week via their online system (see link below). Donations can be dropped off at First Congregational UCC on the table inside the door. Another option is to send a check to the church office designated for Café Ministry. We are in the decision-making process of offering the option to have your food item donations picked up from your home—more details will be given at a later date.

First Congregational writes:

We are still serving to go meals and will be for the foreseeable future, we are excited to be in our new kitchen and able to prepare meals matching what we did while we were in person! It's been a long couple of months cooking strictly out of crock pots and roasters in the youth room but, it was so worth the wait and can't wait to share the space with all of you and your groups.

Starting next week, we are looking for 2 volunteers (no more for safety) to start and join the Cafe committee to as-

sist with packaging up the meals. The times are different from when we are in person as we are matching other meal sites times right now so the guests have a consistent time to pick up a meal no matter the meal site.

Mandarin-Speaking Ministry of John Knox Presbytery

The John Knox Presbytery has a Mandarin-speaking church which meets (virtually these days) at Westminster Presbyterian Church. It is the only Mandarin-speaking church in the tri-state area. It was founded in August 2015. Pastor Stephanie is on their support team through the Presbytery, taking the spot vacated by Pastor Kat when she left FPC.

The purpose of this ministry is to spread the Good News of Jesus Christ in Mandarin to non-believers and disciple existing Mandarin speaking believers in the tri-state area. The congregation hosts a Lunar New Year Celebration so people may have their traditional celebrations even in a foreign country. For Mandarin-speaking international students, they provide opportunities to build relationships with local Christians, with the hope of planting seeds of faith in their hearts. Pastor Moses Wu said he believes the Lord will continue to lead this ministry.

Due to the pandemic, the congregation has ceased in-person worship and has opted to provide sermon videos and



devotional articles for the ministry participants. Each week, they call each person to ask how they are doing and pray for them via phone. Pastor Wu and his wife also do a weekly food fundraiser, where they make traditional Chinese items such as egg rolls, Black peppered chicken and vegetables with rice, and more! FPC Contributes to Iowa Derecho Repair Efforts

On August 10, 2020, severe thunderstorms with long track damaging winds (derecho) devastated Iowa causing widespread power outages for more than 150,000 people for several days. 14 million acres of farmland (40% of Iowa's farmland) were damaged. In September, the FPC Mission & Stewardship Committee donated \$500 to repair efforts through the PC (USA) Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) Program.

PDA is supporting local churches within the Presbyteries of North Central Iowa, Des Moines, Prospect Hill, and Eastern Iowa to respond to this storm. The Latino and Congolese refugee communities in the Cedar Rapids area were significantly impacted, and much of the aid has gone to assist these groups. In addition, the

PC (USA) is in the process of approving four initial assistance grants for the above mentioned presbyteries. Thank you for your continued prayers and support for the people of Iowa affected by the derecho.



CROPWALK 2020 UPDATE: Ending Hunger One Step at a Time


Dear Friends,

Thank you for your support of the October, 2019 CROP Hunger Walk. For the safety and well-being of all involved, the CROP Walk Committee of Dubuque Area Congregations United (DACU) has decided to postpone our planned October 2020 CROP Hunger walk to April 2021. Our local recipients, the Dubuque Rescue Mission, the Dubuque Food Pantry, and People in Need, have said they can survive until then without our usual fall contributions.

The national sponsor of CROP Walk, Church World Service, is in great need of funds now, however, as they also provide resources to those affected by hurricanes. Since they were unable to hold events this spring and summer, they were \$250,000 short at the beginning of August of funds needed to provide hygiene kits and blankets. 
