Will there be a Christmas play at FPC this year?



Community Corner

This new section is meant to provide information on happenings in the community. You may find something of interest or an opportunity to serve. While the Mission Committee is not sponsoring these events, we recognize them as potential ways to build a bridge to our neighbors. Tom Jack has graciously agreed to collect and share this information with us.

A Mesquakie natives' powwow took place in Washington Park on Saturday, October 17, as part of the celebration of Indigenous People's Day. Indigenous People's Day has been officially proclaimed by the

Dubuque City Council to replace Columbus Day.

Why was this event of interest to our church? According to the first paragraph in our church's recorded history, in 1834 Peter Flury came to the "Little Fox Village" newly christened "Dubuque", with the intent to convert the Indians, but when he arrived, he saw "the Germans needed conversion more".

Our church's history has little information on the Sac and Fox tribes who lived on the land we now occupy – their descendants live in the Tama, Iowa, Mesquakie community near Marshalltown, Iowa.

On Indigenous People's Day this year, the Unitarian Church offered a Zoom study of the book *The Indigenous People's History of the United States* — several of us who attended this event found ourselves asking questions like: "Who were these people who welcomed our ancestors onto their land?", "How have we honored their hospitality?", "Do we owe a debt to their Native descendants?" These are questions to consider for all of us, as we learn more about the complicated nature of this area's history.

Participants learned an essential part of preparation for sharing in the Lord's Supper is to understand who Jesus is and what he means to them; as well as taking the time to confess our sin to God. It was a meaningful experience for the children and parents to write out their "faith stories" to share with the group. Children shared that Jesus is their friend, Jesus died on the cross for their sins, Jesus will always love them, and Jesus gives us guidelines for living in the Bible. God used this class to bring all who participated closer together and closer to God.

Report of the Congregational Meeting Oct. 25

Following worship on Sunday, Oct. 25, members met via Zoom for the annual fall congregational meeting to elect officers and at-large members of the 2021 Nominating Committee and to consider the 2021 Terms of Call for Rev. Stephanie Ells. Thirty-nine members and four Ministers of Word and Sacrament were able to join the meeting which was hosted by Rev. Ells and moderated by Rev. Bradley Longfield.

<u>Terms of Call</u>: After the elections, Rev. Ells excused herself from the meeting and Personnel Committee chair, John Dillman, presented the Session recommendation of the 2021 Terms of Call for Rev. Ells. After discussion, the Terms of Call were approved.

Gratitude was given to all those who attended the virtual congregational meeting. It was wonderful to see each other again. The meeting was adjourned with prayer by Rev. Longfield.
