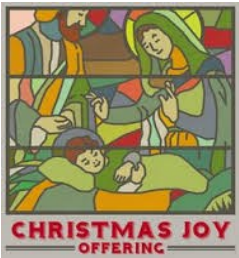
## Community Corner

In November, Dubuque congregations joined for a virtual Thanksgiving Service, sponsored by the Dubuque Area Congregations United (DACU), of which our own Jean Holdener is the President this year. Rev. Stephanie Ells gave the message and the music was provided by the members of the Julien Chamber Choir directed by Kristin Eby. Collections were taken during the virtual service for People In Need (PIN), an organization which provides emergency assistance for those in need locally.

The DACU newsletter this month reminds us of the needs in the community at this time of the year, needs which are compounded by Covid. We are encouraged to give locally to the Dubuque Food Pantry, the Rescue Mission, Opening Doors, Almost Home, and the Lantern Center. 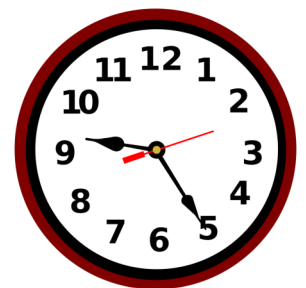

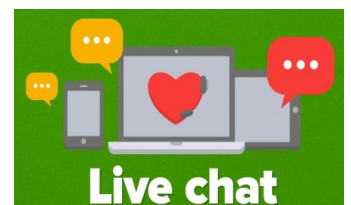
