The Session is excited to announce that, on Sunday, January 17, 2021, during the 10:15 a.m. worship service, the Reverend Stephanie Ells will be installed as pastor of First Presbyterian Church by an administrative commission of the John Knox Presbytery. Because of COVID restrictions, we will be streaming the service.

Rev. Ells began pastoral leadership on August 1, 2020, having been approved by the congregation on May

31, and was welcomed into the presbytery at the August 15 meeting. A graduate of Northwestern College and Western Theological Seminary, Pastor Stephanie wrote in her application in answer to the question about the ministry setting to which she feels called, "God has called me to be a shepherd who knows and cares for her flock. I want to be part of a ministry that is more than a place to attend. It is a place to belong, with all of our quirks, mistakes, triumphs, capabilities, and failings. A ministry where, when challenges or changes arrive, grace and patience abound with a sense of adventure at being part of the work God is doing."

We rejoice that God has brought Pastor Stephanie to FPC and welcome the opportunity to serve Jesus Christ together through the mission and ministry of the church. We plan to celebrate Pastor Stephanie's installation at a later date when it is safe to do so.


Annual Meeting

New Sermon Series and Study Starting Jan. 24

Beginning on Sunday, January 24, 2021, our congregation will be embarking on a journey together of discovering "the Jesus we never knew." Now, you might be thinking, "What on earth are you talking about, Pastor Stephanie? I have known Jesus my whole life! I know the Bible front to back. What do you mean 'the Jesus we never knew'?" Excellent point.

The amazing thing about Jesus is how wide and deep his life and message runs. We learn about Jesus in church as children, but these years do not mark the end of our learning. Our view of Jesus, as I am sure many of you could attest to, grows and changes over the years as we mature and have different experiences with Jesus and his followers. We may even find ourselves confused or questioning our understanding of Jesus' life and message when we have these experiences or read a Scripture passage. This is all normal for a person who

walks with Jesus. Being his follower, and doing so with intentionality and awareness should challenge us.

A few years ago, I read the book "The Jesus I Never Knew" by Philip Yancey; and it brought me wonderful insight into the life and message of Jesus. Yancey does a beautiful job of stripping away all the layers of bias that the church and followers of Jesus have added to the gospel over the centuries. In a straightforward and approachable way, Yancey tackles topics like: Jesus' lessons on love, his demonstrations of grace, the miracles of Jesus, and his death, burial and resurrection of Jesus. Finally, the focus shifts to the effect the life and death of Jesus should have on the lives of believers today as we are to carry on Jesus' message.

Yancey's book is based on the biblical message of the Gospels, and sets a perfect stage for a sermon series and study. **Every Sunday at 4:00pm via Zoom**, there will be an adult study opportunity. We will discuss what was preached in the sermon, the corresponding Scripture passages, and a chapter in the book. Each week of discussion will stand on its own, so you can choose to attend whenever your schedule allows without being there every week.

What is Souper Bowl of Caring?

Souper Bowl of Caring is a youth-led nation-wide program with the goal of tackling hunger in local communities. Collected at the time of the Super Bowl, this program works to transform the big game into a time of giving to local food banks to help those in need.

Is it very effective?

Yes it is! In the 30 years since it begin in 1990, Souper Bowl of Caring has raised over \$163,000,000. Last year, across the nation 5,143 groups raised over 10.5 million dollars in cash and food for local charities. Our church raised \$815 and collected 157 food items for the Dubuque Food Pantry.

How can we help?

Remembering Our Ministry Roots: Meeting Community Needs

First Presbyterian Church in Dubuque worshiped together for the first time on Christmas Eve in 1846. Over the years, FPC has long been involved in community outreach. The Mission Committee's "Giving Tree" donations this Advent season remind us of some of those efforts, both past and present.

The Dubuque Rescue Mission began as a soup kitchen during the Depression. Our congregation has served meals, worked in the clothing store and garden, sorted donations, and offered financial and spiritual support. The Dubuque Food Pantry began in the Mission with the help of our congregation, before moving out on its own. Food for The First and the Souper bowl of Caring offerings continue to support this ministry. Hillcrest Family Services, a Presbyterian supported ministry, began as the "baby fold" with our involvement. We also support Dubuque Area Congregations United (DACU) which began in 1974, have been involved in their CROP Walk and, at Thanksgiving, support DACU's outreach of People in Need (PIN). We give to St. John's Lutheran Church's Closet and Homeless Men's Shelter that grew out of the Center for Public Ministry which our church supported during the community's dark days in the 1980's and 1990's.

At times like this, when we find ourselves groping in the "COVID shroud of darkness," it is good to remember that when community needs arose in the past, our church was there to help meet those needs, and will continue to do the same as we journey into the future.
