# Mission/Stewardship

## Giving Locally, Making a Difference Internationally—OGHS



Our church has participated in one of the Presbyterian Church (USA)'s special offerings, One Great Hour of Sharing (OGHS), using the well-loved "fish bank." These banks were traditionally given to children in Sunday School at the beginning of Lent and collected on Palm Sunday at the beginning of Holy Week. OGHS giving envelopes were also placed in pews. Since neither the banks or the envelopes are available this year because of Covid, the Mission and Stewardship Committee is dedicating this newsletter's "Community Corner" to OGHS to remind us that this offering connects us locally to the

larger church around the world. If Covid has taught us anything, it is the fact that we live in a world-wide community where we interact locally.

Our church has traditionally understood this relationship between the local and world community because of the many students who have participated in our worshipping community over the years and who have gone on to serve the church around the world. One of those students was Maggie Lewis, a former Supervised Practice of Ministry student at FPC. She is now installed as the pastor of two churches in Glacier Presbytery, Chinook and Havre. As a UDS graduate and Presbyterian worshipping at FPC, she is not alone in Glacier Presbytery – both Andy Smothers (in Conrad, MT) and Beth McCaw (the Presbytery's Minister to Ministers) also serve the larger church in Glacier Presbytery. As they carry the Gospel to western Montana churches from Dubuque, they carry on a tradition that began in the basement of our church by Peter Flury: students who are nurtured in Dubuque are sent to serve the larger church around the world.

By participating in the OGHS offering, we continue that tradition today. You can give by sending your monetary offerings to the church office ATTN: Bob Monthey with "OGHS" in the memo line. Pictured right is Maggie Lewis and her Young Adult Volunteer (YAV) site coordinator, the Rev. Jack Mattingly, in 2013 at Glacier Camp. Mattingly supervised Maggie as a YAV before she came to Dubuque, and served as her predecessor as the interim pastor of Chinook Presbyterian Church during its 22-month search for a pastor.

# FROM THE PASTOR

With the sun beginning to shine more often, buds popping out on trees, and the grass turning green; spring is in the air. Spring is a time when hope refreshes along with nature, as we experience new life all around us.

This year, we feel hope on a level we have not felt in some time, as many receive their COVID-19 vaccines and as a church, we have a fuller range of options to consider for gathering together.

The Session has been careful to make the most faithful choices for our congregation within the bounds of public health guidance. I am so proud of how they have attended to the questions of spiritual, mental, physical, and emotional health of our congregation in concert with considerations of viral transmission in the community.

The Session has determined it is time to move into Stage 3 of our COVID-19 Response Plan, which includes the resumption of in-person worship using a sign-up system beginning on April 11, 2021. It is a joy to think about being together for in-person worship again! Yet, we must continue to proceed with care and caution, so our time together will look and feel different from the last time we gathered in the sanctuary.

Full details of what to expect and how to prepare are included in the COVID-19 Response Plan on our church website at [www.firstpresdbq.org](http://www.firstpresdbq.org). Updates have been made to Stage 3, so please review this part of the plan carefully, which includes instructions regarding how to sign-up for a space to attend worship. By using a sign-up system, we are able to keep the Sanctuary at a limited capacity which facilitates the recommended 6 ft physical distance. Mask-wearing will be required as we continue to place a high priority on caring for one another's health and safety.

Of course, we will continue to have worship online, so whether you come to the sanctuary for worship or worship from your own home (or backyard, or car, etc.), worship will happen!

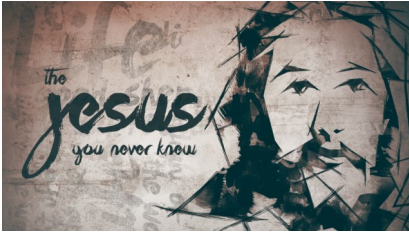

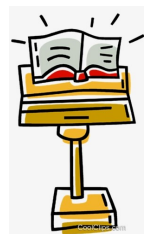

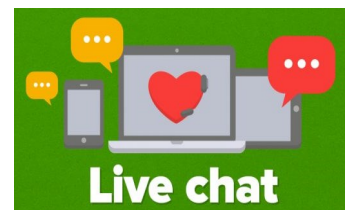
