

COMMUNITY CORNER: Valentine's Day

In the yearly rhythm of church life, certain events stand out as essential for the congregation to define "community life." There are the obvious church feasts and festivals that are loaded with the theological weight of tradition (Christmas and Easter to name just two). But one event stands out for me as a "can't miss" in church. Although its meaning can get lost in the commercialization of our times, only the church can restore to it the meaning that stands in sharp contrast with the meaning given it by the world. That event is Valentine's Day.

For me, the meaning was brought home graphically when my sister died in my arms on Valentine's Day, 2005. Valentine's Day will never be the same. She did not die on our mother's birthday (February 12) out of respect for her, nor did she die the next day on Friday the 13th (she would never let the "odds" have the final word), but she chose Valentine's Day. That night her church had a party. It was an event that will always define "love" for me. At a time when my pain was overwhelming, the church literally "held me in her arms."



Two weeks ago, our sister Joyce McClain died. Her death reminded me of my sister. If there was ever a person who defined what it meant to "give a party," it was Joyce. She relished working on the cakes she brought to Young at Heart each month. Believe me; Duncan, Dane, and Joel relished them as well (not to mention the rest of us).

For my sister and for Joyce, "love" on Valentine's Day will always mean the "giving" of themselves whether by giving cake (for Joyce) or by giving her life (for my sister). Celebrating the holiday as a church family is important for all of us as we can recapture and practice the true sense of what it means to give love to one another, a message sorely needed by the community all around us.

On Sunday, February 12th following the church service at the Valentine-themed potluck, we all have a chance to demonstrate to the world (and remind ourselves) what is the true meaning of Valentine's Day (and relish in eating some cake as well).

The Mission Committee is offering reflections about the relationship between FPC and our Dubuque community in this space as we celebrate our 175th year of ministry. A special thanks to Tom Jack who has been writing these reflections.
