Project Regeneration is for churches in transition and provides a prayerfully guided consultation process that includes expert financial analysis and a range of recommendations for the life and vitality of our shared ministry



together. The project is designed to equip churches with information and confidence to make important stewardship and ministry decisions for their unique context. We have met with our consultant, Kyle Nolan, twice to review the process and discuss the strengths and challenges within our context.

After the Easter season, the session and deacons will be joining together in forty days of prayer and discernment as we consider our options, so watch for opportunities to join us in future newsletters and bulletins. COMMUNITY CORNER: In Times of Uncertainty

This has been a rough week in the life of our church – with the deaths of Karen Stant and Harold Daniels, and the displacement of Paula McNally, not to mention the on-going health concerns of key members, the uncertainties of life have become much more of an issue in the hearts of many of us. Our Sunday school lesson this morning reminded us that we are not alone in this uncertainty: according to the Gospel of Mark chapter 8, just when the disciples thought they knew Who Jesus was and had made a commitment to follow Him right into the Kingdom, He shocked them by saying "the way to eternal life is through suffering and death". Peter was so shocked that he actually rebuked Jesus, Who in turn rebuked Peter by saying "get behind me Satan" in order to set him straight!

Our church building is located in a poor part of town, a neighborhood where certainties are often few and far between while suffering and death can often be the norm. Just getting by is often the best we can expect in this life: we have an old building requiring more and more maintenance and we live in old bodies requiring our daily vigilance! Like the disciples, many of us are asking the same question when life throws us "a curve ball" – the shock can be so great that we find ourselves asking "is this what following the risen Savior is all about? We had hoped that it would not be so hard".

At times like these, I am reminded of the people who occupied this land long before our white settler ancestors had arrived west of the Mississippi River only 200 years ago. These natives were hunted and killed by our white settler ancestors – they were forced to leave the land and live as refugees on an alien land. Jackson Park is revered by our Native brothers and sisters the Mesquakie, The land of Dubuque is their native home, a sacred land next, the ground of their ancestors. They know the land survives and thrives when all else proves to be "temporal" and passes away: their bodies, their dwelling places and even their culture.

What can we learn about certainties in life from our Native brothers and sisters? The land is permanent, the land lives forever, the land is being renewed despite ourselves. Leaving the impermanence of temporal things behind and putting our hope in eternal things carries us through the difficult times of uncertainty. Jackson Park symbolizes the certainty we need in these times of uncertainty, a gift offered to us by our Native neighbors, entrusted to us for our care.

The Mission Committee is offering reflections about the relationship between FPC and our Dubuque community in this space. A special thanks to Tom Jack who has been writing these reflections.
